**TENURE REVIEW - MANAHUNE**

This property borders the Tengawai River for approximately 2 km. In addition, Duck Stream bounds approximately 2.5 km along the western border of the property.

Duck stream is better suited to native fish species and has minimal spawning and fisheries value. The Tengawai River does support a good brown trout fishery particularly in the lower reaches and the river in the area of the subject property boundary attracts some spawning during the winter months.

Any interests that the Fish and Game Council has in respect of this property are principally related to water quality and while existing use continues there is little cause for concern.

**Provisions:**

Fish and Game seek a provision for the establishment of a marginal strip along the Tengawai River border. We note the existence of a road reserve running along the Tengawai River and Duck Stream and provided these are retained we see lesser requirement to set aside any additional marginal strip.

Were the existing use to change include intensified cattle grazing, the likely resultant changes to natural water quality would be of concern.
