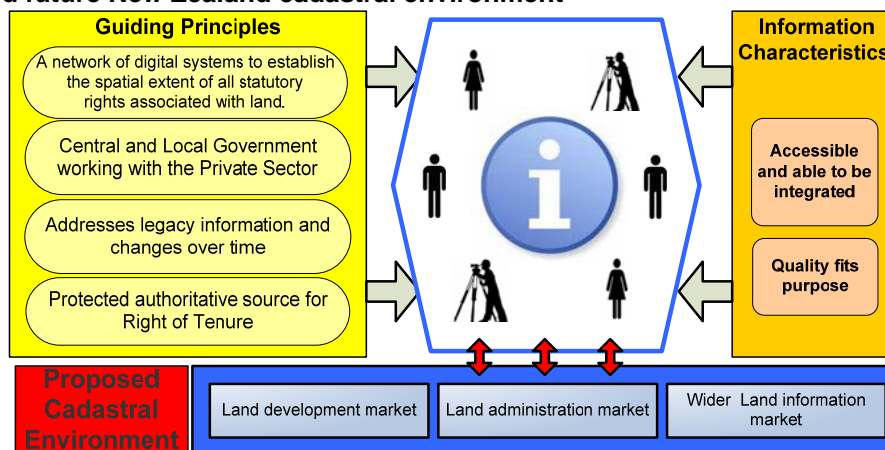


Survey Strategic Context Summary of Working Paper One

LINZ and the NZIS have established the Survey Strategic Context Joint Working Group to examine the cadastral survey industry, and form a shared view of its future shape and how key players interact. This consolidates other developments within the industry, such as mandatory electronic lodgement and the pending changes to cadastral survey rules, to provide a future we can all aim towards.

The working group has considered the views and feedback from industry participants, relevant published papers, statutes and regulatory frameworks, New Zealand's future land development, administration and information markets to outline an operating environment for the future industry.

Proposed future New Zealand cadastral environment



Central to this environment is the information required to define the spatial extent of all statutory rights and privileges associated with land. The environment also acknowledges integration of wider geospatial information that enables land administration and GIS functions.

Within respective markets, the needs of customers are met by effectively managing the relevant information. This information management includes the varied forms of accessing, processing, applying, adding value, storing or dissemination and reuse that occurs across the industries.

Proposed future roles
