FISH AND GAME RESOURCES REPORTS

The Mt Dalgety property encompasses approximately 7700 hectares and is located 20 km west of Albury.

Dalgety Stream and the Hakataramea River are both within the property and support brown and rainbow trout. Both are spawning and fishing waters that require suitable access for angling. Brook char are also present in Dalgety Stream.

There is a locked gate on what Fish and Game understand to be a legal road at the southern end of the property, this may be just outside of the boundary but would provide access to the property. This issue is of concern to Fish and Game and needs to be addressed.

The Shenley Run covers 3233 ha and is located on the northern end of the Hunter Hills of the Dalgety Range. The property is bounded by the Hakataramea River to the west and Lockharts Stream to the north east.

The headwaters of the Hakataramea River feature on this property although not as a fishery as the flows are very low here.

The entire property is considered good upland gamebird country (quail and chukor) and access for hunting should be maintained.
