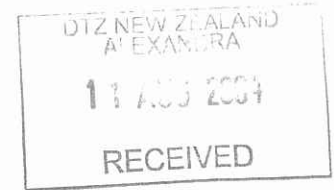
### **Fish & Game Report**

### **Fish and Game Resources Report - Rostriever Pastoral Lease**

The Rostriever Station property comprises two blocks, Run 745 at Otamatata and Run 235D, Lindis/Tarras. Both of these block have some small ephemeral streams, these streams have little Fish and Game value.

#### Run 745

This block runs along State Highway 83, up Loch Laird, along Lake Benmore and then shares a boundary with the Bog Roy property.

There is good quail and chukor habitat available along both sides of SH83, the Otamatata/Omarama Rd.

The fishery values of the property include Corbies Creek where Fish and Game request the retention of current marginal strips and access remains.

We also advocate the retention of marginal strips around the lakeside and request continued complete lakeshore access.

The other waterways on the property do not have notable Fish and Game values.

#### Run 235D

This block is located on the south side of the Lindis and includes Smiths Creek, a tributary of the Lindis River. The Lindis is a well known and notable trout fishery and Smiths Creek provides some spawning habitat for the river.
