## General

### 1. Karakia | Welcome

Matanuku Mahuika opened the hui with a karakia.

#### Obituaries

Matanuku Mahuika acknowledged the recent passing of Lee Smith of Ngāti Kahungunu and noted the assistance as a te reo Māori translator that Lee Smith had given to the NZGB at various times.

The Chairperson acknowledged the recent passing of Tahu Potiki, former Chief Executive of Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu.

#### Welcome

The Chairperson welcomed everyone to the hui. He welcomed observer Philip Green from Te Arawhiti and advised that other representatives from Te Arawhiti would join the meeting when agenda item 11 'Treaty advice' and item 9 'Standard for Crown Protected Area names' are discussed. He also welcomed Daniel Wainwright, on secondment as the NZGB's Advisor responsible for Treaty Names, and other members of the NZGB Secretariat.

The Chairperson congratulated Adrienne Staples on her reappointment to Wellington Regional Council.

The Chairperson noted that Paulette Tamati-Elliffe would be late arriving due to flight disruption.

The NZGB noted earlier discussions with LINZ on branding and communications, and that its former Chairperson, Mark Dyer, had met with LINZ Comms to discuss separate branding. The request had not advanced. The NZGB discussed whether LINZ views the NZGB's strategic priorities as separate from its own and noted that separate branding is a low priority for LINZ. The NZGB agreed that it should take a strategic approach encompassing branding, communication and the NZGB's relationship with LINZ. The NZGB agreed that it should elevate the matter noting sensitivity for the Chairperson as an employee of LINZ. The NZGB noted the lack of public awareness about its work. The NZGB noted the example of the New Zealand Conservation Authority, whose Secretariat sit within DOC, but is independent and has separate branding. The NZGB agreed that a comprehensive discussion about branding, including having its own website and possibly a new logo, be noted as an agenda item for its next hui. The NZGB considers

that the good work that it does is sometimes perceived as being from LINZ. The NZGB noted LINZ's concern for reputational risk. The NZGB is grateful for its strong and positive relationship with LINZ.

- 2018-04-12/18.1. Recorded names to be approved as official – Otago Region: funding, resourcing, Minister, workload for TRONT. **ONGOING/CLOSED**

The NZGB noted that funding issues are managed within the current budget. The NZGB noted that the significant number of Ngāi Tahu names recently recorded and approved as official place names, and that Ngāi Tahu would like its remaining names processed by the end of 2020.

NZGB members were concerned that LINZ Policy had not notified or updated them on appointments and reappointments. The NZGB agreed that this is of particular concern given the number of members whose terms are under review, which could mean a whole new board. The NZGB agreed that the Chairperson should raise this with the Minister for Land Information and suggest that a pragmatic approach be taken where appointments are rolled over to avoid wholesale change of membership. The NZGB noted that the Chairperson had some ability to influence continuity and staggering of NZGB appointments and if left purely to process, skills needed around the table could be overlooked and accumulated knowledge lost. The NZGB noted that Michael Roche would not be available for reappointment and the member appointed from Local Government New Zealand generally only serves a three year term. The NZGB agreed that members would advise LINZ Policy directly of their availability for reappointment.

The NZGB noted the productive meeting with the new Antarctic team from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT) on 7 August 2019. Discussions had covered common ground and the need for New Zealand to be active in place naming in Antarctica. The NZGB noted that MFAT is aware of the work the NZGB does on the international stage in trying to influence other nations to avoid multiple naming of features, and that the new MFAT head, Jana Newman (ex Antarctica New Zealand) understands the role and has previously had a strong relationship with the NZGB. The NZGB noted that there is considerable development happening in Antarctica as other countries set up bases, and there is nothing in place to prevent them over-naming features in the NZ's jurisdiction. The NZGB noted that a newly drafted international Antarctic place naming toponymic guideline acknowledges and accepts the current situation. The NZGB noted that the draft guideline sets out the criteria to be adopted for the future, stating that if there is an existing name a feature should not be over-named. However, at least one country has reserved the right to over-name if the existing name does not meet any of the new criteria. The NZGB noted that the issues may take time to work through and it is hoped something will be confirmed in time for the Scientific Committee on Antarctic Research (SCAR) meeting in July/August 2020. The NZGB noted that undersea feature naming is managed internationally by SCUFN<sup>2</sup>, and this might provide a good model for place naming in Antarctica. The NZGB noted that this had been suggested in the past but the governance arrangements in Antarctica make it difficult.

## Risk review

### 5. Dashboard, Budget, Health and Safety

#### 5.1. NZGB Risk Dashboard

##### **NZGB discussion**

The NZGB noted the information and reports, and dashboard provided (LinZone IDs A3756774 and A3783775).

**s.24 fast track:** The NZGB noted the risk that if 3000 names are not completed annually the process will not be completed within the ten year timeframe. It was suggested that prominent and significant place names could be prioritised rather than focussing on all names throughout the country. This was noted for further discussion.

**Resourcing:** The NZGB agreed that not having sufficient resourcing to complete intended work was a major risk and should be noted as such in the register. The Chairperson noted that to increase the number of FTE<sup>3</sup> positions the NZGB would need to demonstrate that the Secretariat was not sustainably managing the work.

The NZGB discussed its controlled and fixed LINZ appropriations in the total budget. The \$783K appropriation is an amount that much smaller boards are allocated. The NZGB suggested its mapping and other publications work be funded from a discretionary budget. The NZGB noted that budget and resource constraints would make it difficult to advance naming work with local government.

The Chairperson advised that LINZ Policy is assisting with a building a business case for naming suburbs and localities, most of which do not have official place names. The proposal would create an official and authoritative dataset separate from the Fire and Emergency New Zealand localities' dataset. If successful, the work will involve 1-2 extra FTEs within the Secretariat. The Chairperson noted that data from local authorities and electoral boundaries do not always align and a number of factors would need to be considered, including urban and rural area data that Statistics New Zealand publishes, the level of detail needed, and the residents' subjectivity of their addresses.

##### **Actions required**

- *Secretariat to include further discussion on s.24 fast track processing in a future NZGB hui.*
- *Secretary to add the lack of funding to complete intended work to the Risk Register.*
- *Secretariat to prioritise prominent and significant place names throughout New Zealand for fast tracking as a future discussion item.*
- *Secretary to assess RAG (Red/Amber/Green) categories and show key risks only as red.*

#### 5.2. Budget, Team Plan and Initiatives 2019/20

##### **NZGB discussion**

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3772074). The Chairperson highlighted the main points in the report, noting that two summer students will join the Secretariat in November to help complete some of the outstanding projects.

The NZGB noted the suggestion raised by the Māori Names Committee that work on publications be shifted from physical to on-line documents available for downloading. The NZGB agreed that this approach would provide accessibility, simplify the process, and remove printing costs. The NZGB agreed that this would align with its branding and separate URL intentions and could eventually result in a good tool for schools teaching New Zealand history. It also presents an opportunity to improve the pronunciation of place names by using audio files like the Say-it-Tika project did.

The NZGB noted the deadline of the end of April 2020 for submitting its budget bid to LINZ and proposed a more focussed discussion on:

- Planning for budget and work plans.
- Promotion of public understanding about the NZGB's work and taking a leadership role in naming.
- Priorities including branding, public relations and communications, on-line and social media presence, hyperlinks, and Tuia250, Māori Maps and Kā Huru Manu as examples.
- Enabling Māori Crown relationships by broadening Treaty and Māori community relationships at a micro-level to include marae and hapū.

The NZGB noted advice from Te Arawhiti that part of its role is to help build capability and provide tools, including across the public sector, that the government is driving prominence in that area as one of its goals and is working towards true partnership and co-design. The NZGB noted the huge amount of historical information and stories relating to place names that it holds, which could be made more accessible to the public.

The Chairperson agreed to engage with the LINZ's new Chief Executive before the end of the year and invite her to the next NZGB hui, and to talk to the Minister for Land Information about the broader role of the NZGB.

#### **Actions required**

- *Secretariat to investigate/pursue audio files for place names as a future Gazetteer enhancement.*
- *Secretary to contact NZGB members and schedule a focussed face-face discussion before the end of 2020 covering the budget, strategic actions, promotion, outreach, branding, independence, etc.*
- *Chairperson to follow up with LINZ Chief Executive and the Minister for Land Information to discuss the broader role of the NZGB.*

### **5.3 Health and Safety at LINZ**

#### **NZGB discussion**

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3772076). The NZGB noted the new LINZ physical security policy published on 30 April 2019, and that the NZGB Secretariat staff is aware of the policy.

## **Naming rules, delegations, policies**

### **6. Generic terms policy**

#### **NZGB discussion**

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3750062) and the draft NZGB generic terms policy (LinZone ID A3641784). The NZGB noted that work is underway on replacing its *Frameworks* document v.10 with standards designed to increase accessibility to good place naming practice, particularly for proposers.

The NZGB noted under the heading 'Physical features' that when a Māori generic term is already imbedded in a Māori name an additional generic term may not be needed. The NZGB noted general acceptance of the transition towards using Māori generic terms.

## **8. Standard for Antarctic place names**

### **NZGB discussion**

The NZGB noted the information and reports provided (LinZone IDs A3748127 and A3773736). The NZGB noted that section 3.3 'Generic terms' in the draft *New Zealand Standard* should refer to the new Generic Terms policy discussed in agenda item 6. The NZGB agreed that both documents need to be simplified and decluttered so that the public can understand the basic requirements for making a proposal and suggested that hyperlinks also be embedded. The NZGB agreed that the documents would be a useful guide for its own decision making; however, to give discretion and flexibility to its decisions 'must' should be replaced with 'should'. The NZGB agreed that the documents should be recast to be customer facing – an example being the *New Zealand Road Code*, which is a user-friendly guide to the Traffic Regulations.

The NZGB suggested these amendments:

- Consider 'Guideline' or 'Guide' rather than 'Standard'.
- The 'Introduction' be a te reo Māori welcome, that is positive and encouraging to the public.
- **3.1(b) Acceptable names:** Delete 'was of good character'. This acknowledges that based on today's standards a person that a feature is named after may not be considered of good character or reputation but is nevertheless part of the history.
- **3.1(b) Acceptable names:** alter to 'and/or contributed to...'
- **3.1(f) Acceptable names:** Add or amend to 'Some long term existing names (Māori and non-Māori) will not conform to the standard but are historically embedded'.
- **3.2(a) Unacceptable names:** Delete 'vexatious', which has a legal meaning.
- **3.4(b) Spelling standards:** Add to the end of the first sentence 'and/or the hapū or iwi that is associated with the name.'

The NZGB agreed that it would email further amendments, comments and feedback to the Secretary by Friday 29 November 2019. The NZGB noted that once finalised the documents would also be translated into te reo Māori.

### **Actions required**

- Secretariat to update Section 3.3 of the *New Zealand Standard* to refer to the new Generic terms policy.
- NZGB members to email further suggestions and amendments to the Secretariat by 29 November 2019.
- Secretariat to amend the draft standards as discussed.
- Secretariat to develop outward facing documents for public use, to be translated into Māori.

### **NZGB paraphrased discussion on the use of double vowels in Māori place names**

The NZGB noted that a double vowel rather than a macron on a vowel can be a dialectical convention, for example Waikato iwi, and peculiar to some words. Some iwi may also not use macrons in documents.

## 13. Final decisions on proposals that received objections

### Submissions for Tamatea / Dusky Sound

### NZGB discussion

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3758758). The NZGB noted that many of the Whangaparaoa College objectors did not want the English name retained in the dual name, and some had provided 'Tamatea' as an alternative name. The NZGB agreed that the final paragraph of 'Background' on page 3 of the report should be amended to read 'the feature is a fiord because it was formed by the passage of glacial ice'. The NZGB agreed that this is an opportunity to highlight Whangaparaoa College's engagement as a public relations exercise once the Minister for Land Information makes a decision.

### Resolutions

That the NZGB **consider** all submissions for the proposal to alter an unofficial recorded name Dusky Sound to an official dual name **Tamatea / Dusky Sound** and their reasons,

### AND

**Reject** the 15 objecting submissions, including those providing alternative names, based on the reasons provided not outweighing the NZGB's reasons for accepting the proposal, being:

- the NZGB's function to investigate and determine the priority of the discovery of a geographic feature, and to collect and encourage the use of original Māori names on official charts and maps,
- the Māori part of the name being an original Māori place name confirmed by TRONT, and a Te Taura Whiri i te Reo Māori licenced translator having confirmed the orthography,



- retaining the English part of the name making it easier to identify the feature for navigation and in an emergency,
- applying the Māori name first meeting the NZGB's dual naming practice, and a dual name recognising the historical significance of both parts of the name,
- long term use of the generic term 'Sound',
- to acknowledge the history and long term use of the English part of the dual name, and
- dual naming this feature being consistent with the other 17 official dual names for 'Sounds' and 'Inlets' in Fiordland.

**AND**

**Confirm** the NZGB's earlier decision to accept the proposal to alter the unofficial recorded place name from Dusky Sound to an official dual name **Tamatea / Dusky Sound**,

**AND**

**Report** the NZGB's decision to the Minister for Land Information,

**AND**

**Request** the Minister for Land Information to make the final determination on the proposal.

## 15. New geographic name proposals

### 15.1. Te Hapū o Ngāti Wheke (Rāpaki Rūnanga) name proposals (14)

**NZGB discussion**

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3793235). The NZGB agreed that the associated Crown protected area names in the additional Secretariat recommendation on page 1 of the report be deferred until any submissions are received, and to amend the 4<sup>th</sup> bullet point in the recommendation to 'Cass Peak Scenic Reserve to Ōrongomai / Cass Peak Scenic Reserve'. The NZGB also deferred recommendation 2 in the cover report for Rapaki Bay to Rāpaki Bay until after any submissions are processed.

**No. 9: Taukahara:** The NZGB noted that this is the name is for the valley rather than a locality and agreed to notify an amending gazette for its position and feature type.

**No.7: Te Rāpaki-o-Te Rakiwhakaputa:** The NZGB expressed some concern about the length of the name given it is a populated locality. The NZGB agreed that it was important to retain the whole story told in the name and the locality is likely to continue to be shortened to Rāpaki by locals in everyday speech. The NZGB noted the associated name Rapaki Bay and agreed to consider the recommendation to approve it in the standardised form, Rāpaki Bay, once the locality name has been through the statutory process.

**11 and 14: Aua / King Billy Island and Te Piaka / Adderley Head:** The NZGB agreed that it has no maritime safety concerns.

### 15.1.1. Te Tihi-o-Kahukura / Castle Rock

Accept the proposal to **alter** the existing official dual name Tihiokahukura / Castle Rock to an official dual name **Te Tihi-o-Kahukura / Castle Rock**, based on correcting the orthography of the original Māori name,

**Notify** as a proposal to alter for one month.

### 15.1.2. Te Upoko-o-Kurī / Witch Hill

Accept the proposal to **alter** the existing official name Witch Hill to an official dual name **Te Upoko-o-Kurī / Witch Hill**, noting the implication for Stoddart Point (Te Upoko-o-Kurī also being an original name for this nearby feature), based on long term use of the English name, restoring the original Māori name and the dual name recognising equal significance of both names,  
**AND**

**Notify** as a proposal to alter for one month.

### 15.1.3. Te Ahi-a-Tamatea

Accept the proposal to **assign** a new official name **Te Ahi-a-Tamatea** based on restoring the original Māori name. Noting the local use name is Rāpaki Rock. Noting no English generic term is to be added for the rock feature,  
**AND**

**Notify** as a proposal to assign for one month.

### 15.1.4. Te Moenga-o-Wheke / The Tors

Accept the proposal to **alter** the existing official name The Tors to an official dual name **Te Moenga-o-Wheke / The Tors** based on long term use of the English name, restoring the original Māori name and the dual name recognising equal significance of both names,  
**AND**

**Notify** as a proposal to alter for one month.

**15.1.13. Ōmawete / Coopers Knob**

Accept the proposal to **alter** the existing unofficial recorded name Coopers Knob to an official dual name **Ōmawete / Coopers Knob** based on long term use of the English name, restoring the original Māori name and the dual name recognising equal significance of both names,

## 15.2. Malte-Brun or Mount Malte-Brun or Malte-Brun Peak, Malte-Brun Glacier, Malte-Brun Pass, Malte-Brun Range

### NZGB discussion

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3748871). The NZGB noted that TRONT had advised that it was not aware of any traditional Ngāi Tahu names for the features; however, any original names may have been lost. The NZGB noted that Victor-Adolphe Malte-Brun and his father, who were both French geographers, had used a hyphen in their surname, which was of Danish origin. However, Julius von Haast, who had named the mountain, had not used a hyphen as it could be misinterpreted as a cartographic symbol on maps. The NZGB agreed that hyphens are no longer an issue for cartographers and noted that they are used in Māori place names. The NZGB agreed that the names, which had been in long term use, are not a misspelling, and the addition of the hyphen would standardise the orthography. The NZGB agreed that there was no compelling reason for safety or location identification to add a generic term to the name of the mountain.

### Resolutions

*That the NZGB agree to **decline** the proposal to alter through the full consultation process the recorded (unofficial) place name, Malte Brun to either **Mount Malte-Brun** or **Malte-Brun Peak**, based on there being no compelling reasons for safety or location identification to alter Malte Brun (mountain) by adding a generic term.*

**AND**

***Noting** that spelling relates to the correct letters to form a word and renders speech sounds to writing, but does not relate to other orthographic components such as hyphens,*

**AND**

***Approve** the existing unofficial recorded names (standardised with a hyphen): **Malte-Brun, Malte-Brun Glacier, Malte-Brun Pass, and Malte-Brun Range** as official, based on:*

- *the significant amount of research and reference material provided by the proposer indicating that the features were named for Victor-Adolphe Malte-Brun,*
- *the addition of a hyphen standardising the orthography, not altering the spelling,*
- *Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu's advice that it is not aware of any traditional names for the features, and*
- *public objection being unlikely.*

*Subject to confirming the extent of Malte-Brun Range.*

### 15.3. Ngāmotu and Otangiwao

#### NZGB discussion

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3769263). The NZGB noted advice that Rotorua District Council has verbally supported the change, but written confirmation had not been received in time for the meeting. The NZGB noted that consultation with other Māori groups is still on-going. The NZGB noted that Doctors Point is used in some council documents, but this may be a name used locally for the easternmost point of the peninsula where there are a number of properties, rather than the entire peninsula. The NZGB considered that consultation for one month is sufficient and in line with other decisions made at this hui.

#### Resolutions

That the NZGB **accept** the proposal to **assign** a new official name for a peninsula feature **Ngāmotu** based on:

- the NZGB's function to collect and encourage the use of original Māori names on official maps,
- a licenced Te Taura Whiri i te Reo Māori translator having confirmed the orthography, noting no meaning is known,
- evidence of support from some Māori groups,
- evidence of support from Bay of Plenty Regional Council,
- no concerns for identification of the feature without a generic term,
- no concerns that duplication will cause confusion or ambiguity,

#### AND

**Notify** as a proposal to assign for one month.

#### AND

That the NZGB **accept** a new proposal to **alter** the existing unofficial recorded name Otangiwai Point to an official name **Otangiwao Point**, based on:

- the NZGB's function to examine cases of doubtful spelling of names and determine the spelling to be adopted on official maps,
- a licenced Te Taura Whiri i te Reo Māori translator having confirmed the orthography, noting no meaning is known,
- long term use of Point in the existing unofficial recorded name,
- retaining Point being valuable for identification in an emergency, which is supported by the Bay of Plenty Council Senior Maritime Officer (lakes),

**Notify** as a proposal to alter for one month.

#### AND

**Take account of** the NZGB's new Generic Terms policy decided under agenda item 6 of this NZGB hui.

### 15.4. Lancaster Creek and Mount Lancaster

#### NZGB discussion

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3785949). The NZGB noted that historically tramping clubs on either side of Tararua Range have used different names for the peak and the stream is currently unnamed. The NZGB noted that some tramping clubs support the proposals or have indicated that they have no concerns. The NZGB agreed that the rationale to assign Lancaster Creek in association with

Mount Lancaster on the basis that other streams are named in association with peaks in the area eg Thompson (peak) and Thompson Creek, is not compelling. The NZGB noted that the northern crossing of Tararua Range is very challenging and in June this year a man died near the features. The NZGB noted that Muaūpoko Tribal Authority intends to propose names for peaks in Tararua Range in its Treaty settlement and if required the names could be altered later. The NZGB noted that summits in Tararua Range over 1500m are favoured by climbers and the area hosts the most remote hut in Tararua Range.

#### **Resolution**

*That the NZGB **decline** the proposal to **assign Lancaster Creek** as the official name for an unnamed stream, based on:*

- *the proposer not providing adequate rationale or compelling reasons to name the stream, notwithstanding support from some tramping clubs, DOC, and LandSAR,*
- *the NZGB's draft Standard for New Zealand place names discouraging honouring a person with more than one place name, and*
- *the stream being a minor feature that does not warrant naming.*

Letters opposing the proposals from Ngāti Tama ki te Waipounamu Trust dated 8 October 2019 and Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Kuia Trust dated 9 October 2019.

#### **NZGB discussion**

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3769106). The NZGB noted that no response has been received from the tramping community.

## Resolution

That the NZGB **decline** the proposals to assign as official names: **Junction Peak, Kārearea Tarn, Landslip Lake, Mount Mohua, Quantum Peak, Wairua Peak, Weka Tarn, and Zen Peak** to eight unnamed features in Kahurangi National Park based on:

- *Manawhenua ki Mohua, who are mana whenua, opposing the proposals and advising that there may be original Māori names for the features,*
- *the proposers not providing adequate rationale or compelling reasons for naming the features,*
- *Junction, Kārearea, Landslip, Wairua, and Weka being names duplicated throughout New Zealand, which may cause confusion, although they are generally distant from these proposals and some have different generic terms,*
- *the two tarns being very minor features in a remote area, which don't warrant naming, and*
- *there being no compelling reasons for safety to assign new names to the features.*

## 16. Recorded and collected names to be approved as official

### 16.1. Wellington Region (1031 names)

#### NZGB discussion

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3793203). The NZGB noted that Carterton District Council, Kapiti Coast District Council and Wellington City Council had requested that the NZGB defer considering the place names within their jurisdictions as they were not yet prepared or ready to progress them. The NZGB sought clarification on these names:

#### Appendix A (485)

- Belmont is both a hill and a suburb
- Blue Slip (rock) and Blueslip Creek are two different features that are ~60km apart
- Cattle Ridge x2 are distinct features ~80km apart
- Eastern Hutt River and Western Hutt River divide at Rivendell
- Whangaehu Stream x2 are distinct features ~33km apart
- Waiwhetu Stream: Waiwhetu suburb is already an official name.

#### Appendix F (11)

The NZGB noted that these recorded names may still be in use, but the local authority no longer considers them to be suburb names. The NZGB agreed that they should remain as recorded unofficial names with the feature type changed to 'place'.

The NZGB noted the Secretariat's work done on the project to date, which had received positive feedback, and that good relationships have been built with iwi and local authorities. The NZGB thanked Jill Remnant for her work.

## Resolutions

That the NZGB **approve** as **official** the 485\* recorded place names in **Table 1** at the end of these minutes, based on:

- *a licenced Te Taura Whiri i te Reo Māori translator having confirmed the orthography of the Māori place names,*

- the NZGB previously agreeing that the addition of a macron does not prevent a recorded Māori place name being approved as official under section 24 of the NZGB Act 2008 because it is not an alternative name,
- there being no other alternative recorded names known for the features, and
- public objection being unlikely.

- the name being proposed through the Treaty process, or
- the name being formatted with brackets.

and continue to classify these place names as recorded unofficial names.

**Decline to approve** the 11 existing recorded suburb names in **Table 6** at the end of these minutes, and alter their feature types in the Gazetteer to 'Place', based on Lower Hutt City Council advising that the names are no longer in use, and Porirua City Council not including Oneporto with its locality and suburb names, which the NZGB processed in 2010.

and continue to classify these place names as recorded unofficial names.

[\***Secretariat note 1:** Following the NZGB meeting Mākirikiri Stream South Branch was found to be not named on maps, so it is not a recorded place name. And Whareama Sea Valleys was advised as being a single sea valley, so cannot be approved as official with a plural generic term. Therefore, the total reduces from 485 to 483]

## 16.2. Orthographic standardisation

### NZGB discussion

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3736075). The NZGB noted that it had approved Ōhakune at its meeting on 11 April 2019, but the decision had proved to be controversial so Ōhakune was immediately removed from the *NZ Gazette* by a corrigendum, reverting it back to the unofficial recorded name, Ohakune. The NZGB noted that the process had generated some good publicity with the other 823 names receiving some good feedback, which was an overall excellent result. The NZGB noted that Ngāti Rangi has settled its Treaty claim and 'Ōhakune' had not been part of its Treaty settlement. The NZGB suggested that Ngāti Rangi could make a proposal to make Ohakune official under the standard NZGB process, but consultation would be required.

## 16.3. Kā Huru Manu

### NZGB discussion

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3801990). The NZGB noted with confidence that all names have been through a thorough process and TRONT is continuing to work through the remaining names. The NZGB noted the great work done and the positive collaboration between the Secretariat and TRONT.

### Resolutions

*That the NZGB note the additional criteria on orthography agreed between the NZGB Secretariat and TRONT on 24 July 2019, and confirmed by the NZGB Chairperson, being:*

- *if there is no meaning for a place name then specific orthographic advice cannot be provided by a Te Taura Whiri i te Reo Māori licenced translator,*
- *this will not prevent Kā Huru Manu names from being collected in the Gazetteer or approved as official, the NZGB accepts the provenance TRONT has established through oral tradition and evidential research in Kā Huru Manu.*

### AND

**Approve** as **official 17** existing unofficial recorded place names in **Table 7** at the end of these minutes [same as existing names – Category 1], based on:

- *there being no alternative recorded names known for the features, and*
- *the NZGB considering public objection to be unlikely, and*
- *TRONT having confirmed that the existing recorded names are TRONT's tūturu (authentic) original Māori place names, and*
- *a TTWh licenced translator having confirmed the orthography, or*
- *accepting the orthography advised by TRONT and recorded in Kā Huru Manu,*

**Noting** that the NZGB has previously agreed the addition of a macron is not a spelling alteration but standardises orthography,

**Noting two** names, Tikotatahi [existing name **Tikotatahi Bay**] and Wairaurahiri [existing name **Wairaurahiri River**] are subject to TRONT's final comment on orthography,

### AND

**Approve** as **official 14\*** newly recorded place names in **Table 8** at the end of these minutes [new names – Category 2] based on:

- *there being no alternative recorded names known for the features, and*
- *the NZGB considering public objection to be unlikely, and*
- *having no concerns that the names do not have English generic terms, and*
- *a TTWh licenced translator having confirmed, or*

- accepting the orthography as advised by TRONT and recorded in Kā Huru Manu, **Noting one name, Ōteparawa**, is subject to TRONT's final comments on orthography, and **one name, Ōteraumaka**, is subject to a final position,

**AND**

**Note 329** names in **Table 9** at the end of these minutes, were collected [Category 3] in accordance with the NZGB's policy on collecting original Māori names, and published in the NZ Gazetteer.

These names are collected due to a different existing name in the NZ Gazetteer (whether official or unofficial recorded) or TRONT advising of a local use name and advising that approving the name may be controversial.

**Noting** some names are subject to TRONT's final comment on orthography, but as the names are collected they can still be updated in the Gazetteer,

That the NZGB **review** the ~300 Cook voyage names in the spreadsheet in supporting information, noting that some names were given by crew members on the voyages,

8. consider mana whenua views and how to request those views, or
9. do nothing with reasons to be decided by the NZGB,

***Review** and **concur** with this updated proposal to assign the new CPA name, **Whareroa Farm Recreation Reserve,** based on Whareroa Guardians Community Trust Inc agreeing to the proposal, and the name meeting the Standard for Crown protected area names NZGBS60001 (dated 20 April 2012).*

### **17.2. Upcoming CPA name proposals**

**NZGB discussion**

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3782800). The NZGB noted that since this report it has received proposals for Raglan Recreation Reserve and Motu Kanuka Scientific Reserve, which the Secretary will review under delegation. The NZGB noted that it has not yet received a proposal from DOC for Maunga Kākarama Scenic Reserve. The NZGB agreed that its preference is to have 'Maunga' after the name or to have no generic term. The NZGB agreed that in this context the order of the generic term is interchangeable. The NZGB confirmed that it wishes to continue receiving these reports about upcoming CPA name proposals.

### **17.3. CPA relationship hui with DOC**

**NZGB discussion**

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3793004). The Secretary advised that it had been very helpful having Andrew McLellan at the hui held with DOC on 22 August 2019. One of the NZGB's identified risks is the need to improve the NZGB's relationship with DOC and this is being done through better engagement and regular hui. The Secretary advised that DOC intends to write standard procedures for their land managers on how to make proposals to alter and assign CPA names and a consistent format will make things easier. The NZGB noted that it does not receive many CPA proposals, but they continue trickling in. The Secretary advised that an audit between the NZGB's GIS and DOC's GIS is proposed. The NZGB GIS was compiled on information DOC provided but it has now advised that the information was incorrect. The NZGB noted that some CPA Treaty names noted in agenda item 12 were missed because DOC had not informed the NZGB.

- *Secretary to pursue regular hui with DOC.*
- *Secretariat to pursue auditing the NZGB's CPA names against DOC's GIS.*
- *Secretariat to process the missed CPA Treaty names listed under agenda item 12 of this hui.*

## **18. Undersea Feature Names Committee (UFNC)**

### **NZGB discussion**

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3774826). The NZGB member who is also National Hydrographer reported that:

- SCUFN's 2019 meeting had accepted all 16 of the NZGB's fast track proposals, although there had been some debate over generic terms. SCUFN was not convinced that Katz Guyot was a guyot and accepted it as a seamount. The UFNC will reconsider the generic term at its 2020 hui.
- The NZGB's concern at some of the wording in the IHO<sup>4</sup>'s new edition of the *B-6 Guidelines* is now on record. The *B-6 Guidelines* should not prevent SCUFN from accepting Māori names for undersea features in Antarctica. This will be tested when the NZGB proposes Māori names for some of the ~20 unnamed features in the Southern Ocean that GNS Science is providing bathymetric data for. The NZGB noted that GNS Science will no longer be charging ~\$10000 for the bathymetric data it is providing for ~20 unnamed features in the Southern Ocean.
- The Republic of Korea (RoK) is still actively naming features within the NZGB's jurisdiction in the Southern Ocean. However, RoK is consulting with the NZGB before making proposals to SCUFN.
- At its 2020 hui the UFNC will have a new member representing the Navy.

## **19. Māori Names Committee (MNC)**

### **NZGB discussion**

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3773595). The NZGB noted updates on the following actions advised by the MNC Chair:

- **Crean Deep:** The MNC has agreed to try one further time to get a response from Tā Tipene and if not successful the action will be removed.
- **Derivation of Kawhitihu** (seamounts): This action is ongoing and is waiting on information from the translator.
- **Oral History Atlas:** The MNC has agreed to investigate online publication to enable better staging of the process and to remove publication costs.
- **Westpac Hills:** Māori names still to be determined. The hills were named by the fishing industry because of very productive fishing in the area.
- **Terms of Reference:** Minor amendments were agreed.

### **Resolution**

*That the NZGB adopt the Māori Names Committee TOR with the following amendments:*

- *Under Purpose:*
  - *7<sup>th</sup> bullet point: uphold the purpose, functions and duties of the NZGB Act 2008, and*
  - *8<sup>th</sup> bullet point: give effect to the relevant actions set out in the NZGB Strategic Action Plan.*

**Waipaoa Canyon:** The NZGB noted that no feedback had been received from Tūrangānui people, who have an ancestral connection to Waipaoa River, which runs into Tūrangānui-a-Kiwa / Poverty Bay. The NZGB noted that the canyon is beyond New Zealand's 12NM territorial limit\* so it is not necessary to notify a proposal. However, it would be useful to go through a public process, which would give mana whenua an opportunity to make submissions supporting or objecting to the proposal. The NZGB noted that consultation can proceed for names beyond the 12NM territorial limit and section 25 of the NZGB Act 2008 does not bind the NZGB to the outcome of the public process, nor is there risk if any objections are received.

### Resolution

*That the NZGB agree that it makes a proposal to alter Poverty Canyon to Waipaoa Canyon to the Undersea Feature Names Committee for consideration, and publicly consult on **Waipaoa Canyon** (if this is the name that is agreed) noting that:*

- *this is a significant undersea feature that has ancestral connections, and*
- *it is beyond New Zealand's 12NM territorial limit\* and that section 25 of the NZGB Act does not require public consultation to be undertaken.*

## 20. Antarctic Names Committee (ANC)

### NZGB discussion

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3800259). The NZGB noted:

- **New place name proposals:** US-ACAN<sup>5</sup> and USBGN<sup>6</sup> have approved Oliver Bluffs, Córdova Nunatak and Mount Yost. Córdova can be gazetted once US-ACAN advise timing. The ANC has not yet received the Mount Yost proposal.
- **Biannual NZ Antarctic Science Conference:** Response to the NZGB's work presented at the conference was muted, noting that the session was particularly large with 40-60 posters. Naming features in Antarctica was discussed with a number of people and it is anticipated that scientists will gain an appreciation of the work once it is in the SCAR<sup>7</sup> Composite Gazetteer of Antarctica.
- **Bi-lingual Antarctic Flyer:** Tabled: 'Place naming in Ross region of Antarctica', 'Te Taunaha wāhi i te takiwā kit e Moana o Ross i te Tiri o te Moana ki te Tonga'
- **Antarctic Basemap:** The Secretary demonstrated enhancements to the basemap.
- **Antarctic travel:** Christopher Stephens will be going to Antarctica as a Field Assistant on LINZ event K150-1920-A from 23 October to 11 November 2019.

## 21. Secretary's report

### NZGB discussion

The NZGB noted the information and report provided (LinZone ID A3799035). Further to the written report the NZGB noted:

- **LINZ Customer Satisfaction Survey:** Thanks were noted for the NZGB members' responses to the survey.
- **Annual Report:** Tabled: The NZGB's Annual Report will be presented in the House by Monday 21 October 2019.
- **Antarctic basemap:** NZGB members were asked to use the Antarctic basemap and send any comments to the Secretariat.
- **Scanning:** This work is dependent on the LINZ approving the budget of \$25k. The Chairperson advised that if funding comes under OPEX<sup>8</sup>, it is not budgeted for this financial year. However, it will be done this year if possible.
- **Place2019:** The Secretary will present on the New Zealand Gazetteer at this Māori lead GIS conference. This is a positive way to engage with Māori.
- **Compliance:** Further audits would be useful and could be included in the Secretariat's work programme. NZTA have promised to compare their road signs with the NZ Gazetteer but has not yet done it. Signs appear to be replaced only when necessary.
- **Relationships:** Mark Te One is now working for Te Puni Kōkiri (TPK) on contract. However, TPK does not fund his attendance at the NZGB's meetings. The Secretariat will contact TPK to discuss what input is needed from them at NZGB meetings.
- **International:** At the request of the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names (UNGEGN) the Secretary lead the first draft of its strategic plan. This was done in consultation with Queensland, Australia and with assistance from the former NZGB Chairperson, Mark Dyer. The draft has gone to member states with a request for feedback by 13 December 2019. Version 2 will be produced by April/May 2020 and recirculated for further comments with the aim of it being ratified by 2021. Any feedback from NZGB members would be appreciated.
- **Permanent Committee on Place Names (PCPN):** This group is starting to grapple with promoting indigenous Australian place names and replacing introduced names. There are many languages and overlaps in Australia and every state/territory will have a new 'collect' classification just like New Zealand. The PCPN was very excited about the interim measure to get names into their registers. The NZGB noted that due to time and resource constraints not much was being done in the South Pacific region and suggested that the NZGB considers working on a collaborative programme with PCPN (ie Pacific Reset).
- **LINZ Transformation:** The NZGB has been asked to provide comment on how LINZ might perform better in specific areas. Key themes are strategic, connected, innovation and flexible, and outward looking. This will be addressed through the focussed discussion hui to be arranged before the end of the year.

#### **Actions required**

- *NZGB members to provide comments, if any, on Antarctic basemap enhancements to the Secretariat.*
- *Secretary to approach Te Puni Kōkiri to discuss their input needed at NZGB meetings.*
- *NZGB members to provide comments, if any, on the UNGEGN strategic plan to the Secretary.*
- *NZGB to consider collaboration with PCPN on assistance to Pacific Island nations with their place naming.*

## **22. Other business**

There was no other business.

The Chairperson thanked everyone for their contribution to the hui.

On behalf of the NZGB the Chairperson acknowledged the considerable contribution Michael Roche has made to the NZGB over a long period of time, and it had been great to have him at the table. He wished him all the best and said he would be missed.
