## **Response to your official information request**

Thank you for your official information request received via a t ansfer from Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment on 14 April 2023 for the number of GETS tenders, per year, over the past four years, in any and all aspects of cloud computing, that specified a preference for Microsoft, Azure, AWS Amazon, Google systems / products / services, and any combination of these.

Toitū Te Whenua Land Information New Zealand (LINZ) has had four tenders on GETS for cloud computing technology services in the past four years, as outlined in the below table:

Of these, two have specified a preference for a cloud computing provider:

- 1. Intranet Product on Office 365 LINZ put this out as a tender for a supplier on SharePoint so Microsoft was specified as the supplier.
- 2. RFQ2021-57 Security Operations Centre Project LINZ specified this had to provide a service for Security Coverage of our Microsoft environment.

LINZ utilises Microsoft, Azure, and AWS cloud services through either direct usage of those suppliers' services, or where one of our other supplier's services provides the underlying platform in a solution we have procured (Platform as a Service (PaaS) / Software as a Service (SaaS)) but where LINZ do not choose that underlying platform.
