Your query has now been considered at a senior level.

Due to the relative newness of the current farmland advertising requirements, whether a particular situation will qualify for an exemption is likely to come down to its individual facts and the quality of the evidence the applicant can provide to support those facts.

Given the circumstances outlined in your email, we consider at this time that this may well be a situation which could be considered for an exemption but this will only be able to be finally determined upon receipt of an exemption application.

In terms of how long it might take to get a decision on a farm land advertising exemption in these circumstances (noting the general 30 working day target timeframe), we will endeavour to process this as quickly as possible - however it is HION ACT 198 not possible to state with any certainty how long this is likely to take at this time.

#### Good afternoon

Kauri Forestry LP holds a standing consent and has entered an agreement to purchase approximately hectares of land under that Standing consent. The land being acquired is being subdivided (by the vendor) off a larger hectare title.

Settlement is (currently) subject to completion of the subdivision. In order to facilitate a quicker settlement, for the benefit of both the vendor and the purchaser, Kauri Forestry LP is considering offering to settle early by acquiring the whole title, whereby the area to be subdivided and retained by the vendor will be held by Kauri Forestry LP on trust until the subdivision is completed, and then transferred to the vendor. The vendor would have legally enforceable rights in respect of the subdivision area until it obtains legal title.

However, only the hectare area was advertised (reflecting the vendors intention to retain the subdivided area).

Without committing the OIO to any outcome/decision, we would appreciate the OIO's initial view as to whether this situation might qualify for an exemption from the farm land advertising regime, and how long it might take to get a decision on a farm land advertising exemption in these circumstances (noting the general 30 working day target

timeframe). This will allow both Kauri Forestry LP and the vendor to determine whether it is worthwhile applying for this exemption, or whether they continue to wait until the subdivision has been completed.
