
Ruling on vertical control marks

LINZR65303

Purpose of ruling This ruling specifies the survey control marks that the Surveyor-General considers suitable for the vertical control of cadastral surveys.

Related rules in Rules for Cadastral Survey 2010 Rules 4.3(a), 7.3.4(b), and 8.2(a)(xiii) refer to vertical control marks.

Terms and definitions As defined in rule 2 of the Rules for Cadastral Survey 2010 (Rules):

- 'Rules' means Rules for Cadastral Survey 2010, and
- 'vertical control mark' means a survey mark in the national survey control system and being a class of mark specified by the Surveyor-General as suitable for the vertical control of cadastral surveys.

Vertical control mark

- A survey control mark is suitable for the vertical control of cadastral surveys if it has been assigned a height in terms of an official vertical datum with a Landonline order 3V or better.
- Landonline orders are defined in LINZS25006: Standard for tiers, classes, and orders of LINZ data.
