
Year to Date Forestry Performance

Commentary

- LINZ has approved 13 one-off consents under the Special Forestry Test over the period of 1 July 2021 – 31 December 2021. In the second guarter of 2021 there was a reduction in Special Forestry Test decisions, with 2 consents being decided (both in existing forestry).
- As at 1 January 2022, we saw an increase in the number of applications under the Special Forestry Test with 11 live forestry applications being assessed.
- Of those, we have seen an increase in the number of conversion-related investments (from farmland into forestry), with 7 of the 11 live applications being conversion-related. Traditionally, approximately 40% of our work in progress applications are conversion-related.
- Like last quarter, no standing consent applications have been approved October - December 2021, and no standing consent applications are currently being assessed.

- The review of the forestry-related changes to the Overseas Investment Act is underway, with Ministers considering next steps now.
- Targeted stakeholder engagement (led by the Treasury) has continued to be undertaken, with a number of hui with iwi representatives taking place in January 2022.
