Section One - Introduction

1.1 Purpose

The purpose of this report is to advise the Commissioner of Crown Lands on the sports fish and game values present on the land included in the Cairnhill Crown pastoral lease. The lease is being considered for land tenure review and disposal under the provisions of the Crown Pastoral Land Act. As well as habitat values the report covers angling and hunting values and associated access issues.

Information for this report has been researched and prepared by Otago Fish and Game Council staff.

1.2 Location

Cairnhill is located on the east side of Lake Roxburgh, opposite the Gorge Creek confluence and to the north of the Knobbies pastoral lease. Cairnhill pastoral lease takes in a 2-kilometre section of Speargrass Creek.

Section Two - General Resources Information

2.1 Sports Fisheries Values

Cairnhill pastoral lease contains part of the headwaters of the Speargrass Creek. Speargrass reservoir (approximately 1 km downstream of the property) contains a selfsustaining population of brown trout, which spawn in Speargrass Creek.

The pastoral lease bounds part of Lake Roxburgh, which contains both rainbow and brown trout population. Lake Roxburgh also has a resident salmon population and contains significant numbers of seaward migrating salmon moving through the lake during November and December of each year.

Angling opportunities within the lease are restricted due to the river size.

2.2 Game-bird Values

4.1 Habitat Views Any areas that currently do not have marginal strip along the lakefront should be protected by laying off marginal strips.

The spawning and rearing values of Speargrass Creek should be protected by way of marginal strip to ensure the continuation of the Speargrass Reservoir population.

4.2 Access Views There are no significant Fish and Game values that require the provision of access.
