Note: Plans which form part of the Conservation Resources Report are published separately.





Area striped with green should be returned to full Crown ownership and control, while area striped with red could be made freehold. Blue lines indicate the property boundary; yellow lines indicate important public access routes, heavy black lines indicate legal roads.



Map 2: Lower block of Castle Dent Pastoral Lease showing preferred outcome of tenure review. Areas outlined in green should be returned to full Crown ownership and control, while areas striped with red could be made freehold. A small area of kanuka/beech forest could be protected by convenant (pink). Blue lines indicate the property boundary; yellow lines indicate important public access routes, heavy black lines indicate legal roads
