Otago Fish & Game Council Resource Report

General:

Lower Cascade Pastoral Lease in located in the Cascade River in South-Westland. It is a small irregular shaped parcel of land on the river flats, and flanked by native bush on the slopes and mountains. The flats contain a mixture of exotic pasture grasses and swampy wetted areas. Access through the property is at the leaseholders discreation.

Sports Fishery Values:

The main river channel and side tributaries contain some excellent angling opportunities with large resident and sea-run sports fish caught on a regular basis, particularly during the whitebait season.

Game Bird Values:

The property contains excellent Paradise shelduck habitat () and there are resident birds in the valley. There is little, if any, recreational game bird hunting, possibly due to the isolation of the property.

Recommendations:

The side tributaries require marginal strip or conservation covenant protection to protect fishery habitat values.

Vehicle access to the waters edge is required to allow for jet boat entry into the Cascade River. Legal foot access that allows travel through the property to the lower and upper reaches of the river should provided for.
