This area has high visual and ecological values, as well as containing the paired water races of high heritage value.
A protective covenant is required for this area to enable the protection of these values in perpetuity.

The middle country of Stony and Bogside blocks (on right) is tall tussock grassland with significant inherent values in ecology, landscape and cultural heritage. The severely modified landscape on the left (also taken on Pisgah Downs at its boundary with Dome Hills) is the potential fate of the Pisgah Downs tall tussock landscapes, if left unprotected by covenant or conservation status (photos taken by A Steven on 25 October 2005).




Photo 6.
