



RIGHT IN RESPECT OF NATURAL WATER

Pursuant to Section 21 (3) of the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967, the Otago Regional Council hereby grants to:

Name: David Malcolm Macdonald and William Andrew Macdonald

Address: C/- Fraser Macdonald Martin & Co, P O Box 40, Ranfurly

the right to take 200,000 litres per hour from the Pigourn, to discharge the same into Harpers Creek, and to retake the same

for a term expiring on 1 April 2000

for the purpose of irrigation

Legal Description of Land at points of taking, discharge, and retaking: Run 204D and Section 2 Block VIII and Section 23 Block IV Upper Taieri Survey District. Map references S.145;802397, S.145:805414 and S.145:797446

This right is subject to the following Special Condition (s):

- 1. That his right shall not be exercised except during the period 1 April to 30 September, without the express consent of all the holders for the time being of current water-race licences in the Pigburn or of rights granted in substitution for expired water-race licences.
- 2. That this right shall not be exercised except when there is continuous surface flow in the Pigburn from Patearoa-Hamiltons Road to the Taieri River.
- 3. That this right shall be exercised in co-operation with the exercise of Rights Nos. 417, 627 and 2131.
- 4. That this right supersedes Right No. 427.
- 5. That Council reserves the right to appoint a water-allocation controller or committee for the Pigburn catchment or any part thereof, and to place this water right under his or its control.
- 6. That the terms and conditions of this right are subject to review within one year of Council's adoption of a management plan for the Taieri River.

APPLICATION TO FORM A WATER RACE: BEECHES II

I refer to my letter of 17 May 1990 and our subsequent inspection.

As discussed with you this matter has again come to the fore. I inspected the latest proposal with David MacDonald, Tom Aitken, Cynthia Clark and Geoff Heward on 3 December. I attach a series of photos from this inspection and also our previous inspection. I also attach maps of the proposals. On 4 December the MacDonalds arranged further survey work and some test drilling the results of which are contained in this letter.

Three proposals have been looked at.

1. A water race formed on a benched platform wide with 3 m approximately 1300m through the pastoral lease and 3 - 4 km through adjoining land before dropping into a and being picked up by an existing race lower down the mountain. This option would extract water from two the previously preferred site. One 240 metres up the main stream and the other 120 metres up a westerly branch. This option still meets the requirements of the water right.

A variation of this option was to put a siphon through the westerly branch. This siphon would need to be 50 m long and would have considerable impact. The water from the western stream would also be lost.

- 2. A dam at point E. This option is not favoured due to high cost and the impact of the lake which would be formed.
- 3. An alternative to option 1 is to dig a deep trench (Max 4m) from point H through points G, F and E. This would initially

be 1.5 m wide and the race piped (in 300mm concrete pipes) through it then back filled with the topsoil and vegetation replaced. Some exploratory drilling has been undertaken on the main ridge and this has indicated that this is feasible. A trench would need to be blasted through the rock at point E and an experienced explosives user as said that this is feasible. The advantage of this option is that the distance up the creek is shortened. This option will be more costly.

I agree in general with the proposal. My personal preference is for option 3 subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That before work commences an accurate survey confirms that water extracted at point D (below the forks) can be conveyed to point I.
- 2. That the rce and bench not exceed 3m in width with batters not steeper than 1 in 2.
- 3. That the bench and batters be seeded in March with a suitable seed mix.
- 4. That the trench width not exceed 1.5 m at the top and that the topsoil be carefully saved and replaced on completion.

As the most appropriate machine for this work is to be sold out of the district in the near future your early response to this proposal would be appreciated.




DESCRIPTION OF REFERENCE POINTS

- A Extraction point as surveyed by Hoods. 240 m above forks which are preferred extraction point. 4 metres above datum (H).
- B Point on upstream side of forks. 200 m from A. 3.8 m above datum.
- C Crossing over west branch. 90 m from B. 3.7 m above datum.
- D Preferred extraction point at forks. 0.85 m above datum. Current survey (Point D1) is 3 m above this. D1 is 50 m from B and 120 m from C.
- E Dam Rock. This is the site of one alternative which was to dam the creek with a 5 m high dam. Point E is 3.1 m above datum and 600 m from point D.
- 2nd Rock. This is 70 m from Point E and 3 m above datum.
- G Ridge Top. This is 4.75 m above datum.
- H Saddle. This point represents datum and is 120 metres from point F.
- I Boundary Fence. At this point the race leaves pastoral lease land.

Total distance option 1 (ABCDEFHI) is 1300 metres.

Total distance option 2 (DEFGHI) is 880 metres.






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Beeches II - Proposed Water Race



C - Crossing on Side stream







E - Dam Rock (Proposed Dam Site) F - 2nd Rock







E - Dam Rock F - 2nd Rock







F - 2nd Rock G - Ridge Top H - Saddle






Preferred Extraction Point

APPROVAL FOR WATER RACE FORMATION, BEECHES II

I am pleased to inform you that your application to form a water race leading out of the true left bank of the Pig Burn on Beeches II has been approved.

This proposal entails the construction of an intake structure at point D on the attached map with the water being carried in a race to approximately point E where it will enter a 300 mm diameter concrete pipeline laid in a trench approximately 4 metres deep through to point H from where an open water race will be constructed to point I on on the Beeches II boundary. This work has been approved subject to the following conditions:

- That before work commences an accurate survey confirms that water extracted at point D (below the forks) can be conveyed to point I.
- 2. That the race and bench not exceed 3m in width with batters not steeper than 1 in 2.
- 3. That the bench and batters be seeded in March with a suitable seed mix.
- 4. That the trench width not exceed 1.5m at the top and that the topsoil be carefully saved and replaced on completion.
- 5. That the tussocks and inter tussock vegetation be placed to the side with adequate soil (approx 30cm) and replaced following excavation.

Advise is to be sought from Mary Wallace (D.O.C) Alexandra regarding this transplanting procedure.

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- 6. That surplus material is disposed of in a tidy manner. (Either removed from the mountain or placed in suitable location and revegetated with native material).
- 7. That Landcorp, Alexandra be notified of the date work is to commence to allow oversight of the operations.

This is further to our conversation of yesterday.

is recommended that approval be given to the option of trenching from point H through points G, F and E. This will enable water extraction at point D. Approval to be subject to the following conditions.

- 1 Conditions 1-4 as outlined in your letter 4 December 1990.
- 2 the tussocks and intertussock vegetation be placed to the side with adequate soil (approx 30cm) and replaced following excavation Instruction will need to be provided on this method to ensure survival. We will be happy to provide guidance on this aspect.
- 3 That surplus material is removed. It is considered that heaps of spoil which will end up to be heaps of weeds should not be left on the top of the range.
- 4 That the project be closely supervised.


