Section One - Introduction

1.1 Purpose

The purpose of this report is to advise the Commissioner of Crown Lands on the sports fish and game values present on the land included in The Wandle Crown pastoral lease. The lease is being considered for land tenure review and disposal under the provisions of the Crown Pastoral Land Act. As well as habitat values the report covers angling and hunting values and associated access issues.

Information for this report has been researched and prepared by Otago Fish and Game Council staff.

1.2 Location

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The Wandle Pastoral lease is located in the Strath Taieri area and fronts on to the main road between Middlemarch and Hyde. It encompasses parts of the catchment of three Taieri River tributaries - Wandle Creek, Lug Creek and Nant Creek.which drain from the Rock & Pillar range.

Section Two - General Resources Information

2.1 Sports Fisheries Values

Wandle Creek, Lug Creek and Nant Creek all have value for brown trout spawning and rearing. Mature trout migrate up from the Taieri River to spawn between April and July each year. The developing eggs incubate in stream bed gravels, hatch out and the juvenile trout grow and migrate downstream into the Taieri River.

2.2 Game-bird Values

A pond on the property (Map ref. H43 - 874291) is used as a breeding area for mallard duck and paradise shelduck. The pond also contains brown trout.
