

Discretionary activities factsheet

Written consent is required for some activities on a Crown pastoral lease. Pastoral activities fall into three classifications:

- Permitted: These activities **do not require written consent**. These activities have no more than minor impact on the inherent values of the land.
- Discretionary: **Written consent is required before** you undertake the proposed activity.
- Prohibited: **Never undertake these activities**.

<p>Burning vegetation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any activity other than permitted or prohibited activities. <p>Soil Disturbance</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any activity other than permitted or prohibited activities • Soil disturbance for the construction of buildings and infrastructure. <p>Pastoral activities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New or additional irrigation • Burning vegetation • Clearing indigenous vegetation • Cropping, cultivating, draining or ploughing • Clearing drains (other than an activity that is a permitted pastoral activity) • Constructing buildings and infrastructure • Constructing water storage infrastructure, including dams • Creating new fire breaks. 	<p>Pastoral activities (cont),</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Felling, selling or removing any timber, tree or bush (not including invasive exotic pest plant species where the activity is a permitted pastoral activity) if the consent of the Commissioner is required under section 100 of the Land Act 1948 • New fencing (other than an activity that is a permitted pastoral activity) • Forming new paths, roads, or tracks • Planting vegetation (other than riparian planting) • Sowing seed • Spraying a slope to remove vegetation, and replanting the slope in stock or forage crops • Top-dressing • Any other activity that affects, involves, or causes soil disturbance (other than an activity classified as a permitted activity or prohibited activity). <p>Stock limitation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Granting, varying or revoking an exemption from any stock limitation.
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
