Te Horopaki / Background

 On 3 June, the Cabinet Economic Development (DEV) Committee invited the Minister for Land Information, in consultation with the Minister of Transport, Minister of Local Government, Minister for Māori Development and Minister for Infrastructure, to report back to DEV on possible PWA legislative changes in addition to the operational changes on 1 July.

Tūranaga / Current status

2. We provided you with a draft Cabinet paper for Ministerial consultation (BRF 20-619 refers), and conducted formal agency consultation at the same time.

Tūkupu / Comment

- 3. An updated draft Cabinet paper is attached. From the formal agency consultation we received feedback that prompted three changes to the paper, these are:
 - 3.1. Paragraph 29 option three has been clarified to say that the full survey plan is deferred from Notice of Intention stage to the Proclamation stage. This is a minor change from the previous version of the Cabinet paper which required a full survey plan prior to the hearing of an objection or Proclamation. Requiring a full survey plan before the hearing of an objection would mitigate the time saving, and create un-necessary confusion.
 - 3.2. Paragraph 61 this paragraph was provided by the Treasury's Regulatory Quality Team and confirms the suspension of Regulatory Impact Analysis requirements applies to this proposal.
 - 3.3. Recommendation 9 was modified to refer explicitly to Recommendation 2.

Ngā Tāwhaitanga / Next Steps and/or angawā / timeframes

- 4. Subject to any changes you want to make, the Cabinet paper needs to be lodged by 10am on Thursday 25 June to be considered by DEV on 1 July.
- 5. On Friday 26 June we will provide you with supporting documents for DEV talking points, information about recent PWA decisions (and the Mount Messenger Bypass cases), and alternative recommendations in case Cabinet decides to seek urgent legislative changes.
