



Official Geographic Name Proposal within the Ross Dependency, Antarctica

Includes all islands and ice shelves within the Ross Dependency: generally south of 60° S latitude, between 160°E longitude and 150° W longitude. Not including the continental shelf of the Ross Dependency.
